**1. Welcome and Introductions**

**2. Emergency Management Update**

**• G2300 EOC/ICS Interface training course March 28-29, 2023**

- This free training opportunity will be presented at the Sheriff's Office and consist of two 4-hour evening sessions, one on March 28<sup>th</sup> and the other on March 29<sup>th</sup>, explaining the difference between Incident Command System and Emergency Operations Center, and how those two functions communicate with each other. Participation is highly encouraged. Please share this opportunity with your municipal/town leadership, police and fire chief, emergency manager, road/DPW supervisor, and public information officer. The course can then be located under the calendar "Schedule" for registration.



- **New Calumet County Commodity Flow Study and local government participation**

- Developing a study to determine how units of government would respond to a hazardous spill. The county's planning contractor will be reaching out to Town/Village/City fire, law and DPW officials to participate in study.

- **County PFAS Foam Disposal Update**

- Completed proper disposal and replacement of county's existing PFAS foam supply.

### **3. Planning, Zoning and Land Information Update**

- **County-wide Zoning Map Update**

- Earlier this year, county started working on creating a new multi-use mapping application and expanding that to create a county-wide zoning map
- This application will be replacing most of the functionality that is currently on our existing multi-use online mapping application. That application contains a lot of information, but it is not very intuitive, it takes a long time to load. That app. will be going away in 2023 and most of the primary services people used it for will be incorporated into this new application.
- The intent of this project was to make an easy-to-use mapping application that is both up-to-date, and readily available for municipalities, realtors, and the general public to use.
- This new application is a free service for municipalities to use, the only thing we request for those that choose to participate is to fill out the form located on our website for any map amendments.
  - Form is very simple to fill out. The only items required are your name, email address, municipality, and a copy of your approved map amendment. We require the documents, so we know everything has been approved, and so that our GIS staff has a visual reference for what is being changed.

- **2025 Comprehensive Plan Update**

- The Year 2025 Comprehensive Plan will be coming due in a couple years, so we are currently starting the process to update the plan.
  - The Comprehensive Plan is a comprehensive plan or guide for developing a community. Comp. Plans are not regulatory in nature, but rather an outline for long-range planning and community development.
  - Comprehensive Plans focus on 9 elements, including: issues and opportunities, housing, transportation, utilities and community facilities, agricultural, natural and cultural resources, economic development, intergovernmental cooperation, land-use, and implementation
    - Our Plan was originally created in 2007 and since amended in 2012 and 2016. By state statute, Comp. Plans are required to be updated at least once every 10 years to remain compliant.
  - Since we are coming due for the actual Plan year, we feel it is best to perform an in-depth update to the existing plan.
    - There is a lot of good information in the current plan, so we may be able to keep a lot of our existing information and only need to update what we feel is necessary.
  - One of our goals with this update is to condense the existing plan into more of a user friendly, concise document. It is currently 600 + pages.
  - Over winter, Chris Meuer and Matt Halada will begin the process of creating a draft RFP to hire a consultant for the update.

#### Calumet County

These public/private task forces will be kicked off in November to create solutions to the issues perceived by businesses to be some of the most important contributing factors to their inability to recruit and retain employees. - Remodeling 2<sup>nd</sup> floor of courthouse, reorganizing and providing centralized lobby for Health and Human Services
- Beth Hauser expressed her thanks to election officials and municipal clerks for their work during the Nov. 8 election.
