After the Governor's press release today and after discussion with our county corporation counsel, a decision has been made to allow Calumet County pet groomers to complete certain business tasks, including grooming and the exchange of purchased items, provided the groomers follow the guidelines outlined below:

- Lobby areas must remain closed
- Customers are not allowed in the building
- Pet exchange must occur via curbside drop off/pick up
- Scheduled drop offs/pick-ups must ensure compliance with physical distancing of 6 feet
- Purchases must be completed online or by phone; there should be no cash exchange and the store may not require a signature by the customer

Owners and employees:

- Should avoid touching their face
- Wear masks in situations where 6 feet of physical distancing cannot be met
- Wash hands frequently, including after touching their eyes, nose, or face and after pet exchanges occur
- Frequently disinfect areas that are repeatedly touched
- Maintain physical distancing of at least 6 feet between employees
- Stay home if experiencing any of the following symptoms:
 - Fever of 100 degrees F or more
 - Cough
 - Shortness of breath
 - Sore throat
 - Respiratory illness
