Disposal Drop-Off Locations

For Calumet County Residents



Never Flush or Pour!

Unused or expired medications should never be flushed or poured down the drain.

These potentially dangerous drugs can contribute to contamination of our water supply & drug overdose/ death if not disposed of properly.

Residents can safely dispose of drugs for FREE at the locations listed to the right.

Drop-Off Guidelines

1. Empty all pills into a clear, sealed 'ziplock' style bag that is sandwich size or smaller.
2. Keep all liquids, creams and powders in original containers.
3. Recycle empty pill bottles and paper boxes in your home recycling bin.
4. Discard all plastic caps in your home garbage.
5. Drop off liquids, creams, powders & bags of pills at designated locations.

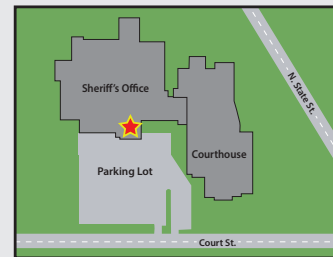

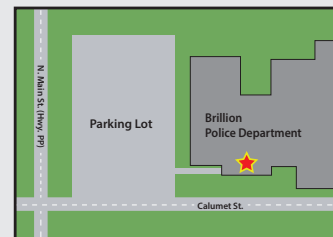

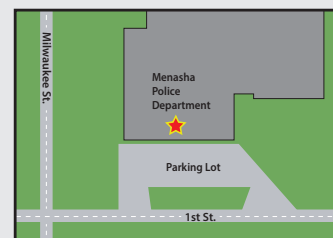
